Tony has written a description of his courses:

1. STEP-BY-STEP INSTRUCTION FOR BEGINNERS (Class # 12WFA302): Learn how to use color and values to add excitement to your paintings. This class is geared for beginners . To ease the learning process, classes will offer step-by-step exercises for varied subjects including landscapes, seascapes, architecture, and still life. Individual interests will be accommodated. **One on one review will be provided. Hours: 24.00** There are 2 openings remaining as of November 21st.

2. INTERMEDIATE (Class # 12WFA 373): Explore more complex issues of composition, technique, and values. Using examples and demonstrations, work on your favorite subjects or new subjects, and heighten your interpretation and expression. Numerous landscape, cityscape and marine-scape examples, painted or photographic, are available when needed. Express yourself artistically through this wonderful watercolor medium. **Hours: 24.00**

3. LIGHT IN PAINTING (Class # 12WFA396): Explore the differences between full-faced, countrejour (back-light), overcast, and side lighting for your painting. Examine different techniques of color and composition to capture the mood of different "lights" of the Impressionists. Using recent paintings and examples of the European and American Impressionists, we will produce paintings of new subjects or renderings of famous paintings. Individual guidance will be offered. Impressionist painters are rightly famous for their use of paint and light. **Hours: 24.00**
